- More than 3,200 people found hope and help last year through LifeWire's services, but we know there are thousands more experiencing domestic violence who need support to live safer and healthier lives.
- LifeWire helped 282 families find safer housing, but for each family served, we had to turn away three others who also needed housing to escape domestic violence.
- We partnered with five high schools and one college, but there are more young people in our community who need skills to build healthy relationships.




TOTAL END OF YEAR NET ASSETS **\$3,785,779**
